# Joseph Steven Spidell

September 7, 1948 – February 14, 2023

Born to Bill and Carolyn Spidell, Steve had one sibling, James. They all pre-deceased him. Steve was a studious child and young man, presaging his ability to excel in academic endeavors. He held degrees from University of Texas Austin, (B.A.,) Austin Presbyterian Seminary, (M.Div. and D. Min.) and Wesley Theological Seminary, (D, Min.)
