PHILIP-EYE

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

The Session has called a congregational meeting for **December 20** immediately following the 11:00 a.m. worship service. The meeting will be conducted via Zoom teleconference. The purpose of the meeting is:

- 1.To elect a trustee to serve a three-year term. The Congregational Nominating Committee will nominate Bob Ardell. Additional nominations are possible with prior consent of those being nominated.
- 2. To elect two persons to serve two-year terms as at-large members on the Congregational Nominating Committee. The current nominating committee will nominate Laura Burgess and Jo Helland. Additional nominations are possible with prior consent of those being nominated.
- 3.To approve the sale of property the church owns in Montgomery County, as recommended by the Trustees.

This is a 13,430 sq. ft. lot located in the undeveloped subdivision Roman Hills. Roman Hills is located between SR105 and FM 2584 in Montgomery county. The property was gifted to Central Presbyterian Church in 1982, and the church has been paying property taxes of approximately \$10 for the past forty years. It is not known when or if the subdivision will ever be completed. Since 1997 there have been two sales of properties in this subdivision listed on MLS. In 1997 a lot with a 1355 sq. ft. home was sold for \$48,500, and in 2011 an 18,088 sq. ft. lot which fronts on Hwy 105 sold for \$230,000 for use as a commercial convenience store. The St. Philip property sits at the back of the subdivision. St. Philip has received an offer to sell the property for \$2,000 with the buyer assuming all costs. Considering the lack of sales for these types of property and the uncertainty of finding another interested buyer anytime in the future, the Trustees (Tom Anderson, Beth Atkinson, and Butch Wilson) recommend selling the property for the price of \$2,000. Former trustee Pam Keever has assisted the Trustees in this matter.

BOB ARDELL - TRUSTEE NOMINEE

Bob was born in Illinois and attended a Presbyterian school, Monmouth College, majoring in geology and economics. After earning his master's degree at Kansas State University, he moved to Houston to start his career in the oil industry and was soon transferred to New Orleans. Bob was ordained as a ruling elder at John Calvin Presbyterian Church in Metairie, Louisiana, in 1969. After coming back to Houston, he served as an elder and trustee at Timber Ridge Presbyterian church in Spring. Bob also served on the Presbytery's New Church Development committee during the 1980s.

After many years at First Presbyterian of Houston, Bob and his wife, Lee, joined St. Philip in 2015, where he has volunteered with Kids Against Hunger and participates in the Church and Society class. The Ardells' daughter Becky is pastor of John Knox Presbyterian in Spring Branch, and daughter Annie works at the Museum of Fine Arts Houston. Bob and Lee also have four grandchildren.
