I wanted to reach out to say thank you. Amazing Place has had an overwhelming response for our Memory Training class this month, due in large part because of your help in getting the word out about the session.

As we mentioned in the flyer we distributed, this particular class is being offered free, on a first-come, first-served basis. We are now reaching out to those on our waiting list to try and schedule them for future sessions which we plan on holding in September, October and November.

Please note that these additional Memory Training classes will have an \$80 fee. As you may know, COVID-19 has forced us to close our in-person Day Program for the remainder of this year. As a result, Amazing Place is moving to a fee-based model for programs and services during this pandemic. This will allow us to support our participants, families, and caregivers in innovative ways that at the same time provide us critically needed revenues. We feel confident these initiatives, including Memory Training, are not only needed but greatly appreciated by those participating in them.
