## ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

Thanks to your generosity during the Easter Season, $\$ 7,655.76$ was collected for the One Great Hour of Sharing Communion Offering. One of the beneficiaries of this offering is Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). PDA is providing emergency relief and shortterm recovery to the people in the area impacted by the earthquake in Nepal. Immediate response will help provide needed food, water, supplies, and medicine to the towns and villages. As long term recovery plans are developed, PDA will accompany and further finan-
cially support our partners in the area to insure that a comprehensive recovery is sustained.

## Dear Friends,

It is a season of markers and milestones. Some are celebrating graduations, while others are gathering with classmates for reunions. Some are being married, while others are celebrating anniversaries. Students and teachers are marking the end of another school year, wrapping up, moving on, and giving thanks. I myself have a couple of dates of significance in these weeks: soon it will be 25 years since I graduated from Princeton Seminary and 25 years since Deb and I were married. June 1990 was a big month in my life!
While it pops up in different places from year to year depending on when Easter falls, Pentecost happens in this season of celebrations. Pentecost is its own kind of marker in the biblical story, an indication that the purposes of God shown in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus continue on through the power and presence of the Holy Spirit. That Pentecost day, sometimes portrayed as the birthday of the church, is the day when the Holy Spirit moves dramatically to gather people across all sorts of boundaries and categories. In the description of Pentecost in Acts 2 we read words like "amazed," "astonished," "bewildered," and "perplexed" as people respond to what the Spirit is doing in their midst. It's all more than anyone can fully grasp.
I find the markers and milestones in our lives become occasions to reflect on the abundant, creative, unpredictable nature of the Holy Spirit. When I graduated from seminary, parish ministry still seemed like a remote possibility for my life. When Deb and I were married, we would have been hard-pressed to map a journey that would take us to Houston, via London, Philadelphia, Ohio, and Kerrville. Yet, through the nudgings of the Holy Spirit and a series of providential encounters and opportunities, this is where we find ourselves all these years later. And I am amazed and astonished by it all - and deeply grateful.
