WORSHIP NOTES

Today's readings from the Revised Common Lectionary are:

- Acts 1:6–14—After Jesus' ascension, the disciples go to Jerusalem and pray.
- Psalm 68:1–10, 32–35—God rides upon the clouds, and gives power to the people.
- 1 Peter 4:12–14; 5:6–11—You are suffering now, but the God of grace will restore you.
- John 17:1–11—Jesus seeks the glory of God and prays for his disciples.

MUSIC NOTES

Organ music — This morning's **opening voluntary** comes from one of Olivier Messiaen's most magical works, a 1930s suite on the subject of the Ascension of Christ. "Serene Alleluias" lives up to its name: this is a gently ecstatic musical world, yet one that relies on its composer's idiosyncratic and highly detailed way of organizing pitches and rhythms. The **closing voluntary** is one of several Bach settings of the German chorale tune *Allein Gott in der Höh sei Her* (All Glory Be to God on High). With the lightly decorated melody riding above a sturdy four-part texture, Bach supplies imaginative links between phrases, as he seems to have done during congregational singing throughout his career.

Vocal music — This morning's **first solo** — *Christ Whose Glory Fills the Skies* — features Charles Wesley's well-known text set to new music in 1986 by Allan Robert Petker, who is conductor of the California-based Consort Chorale in the San Francisco Bay area, Santa Clarita Master Chorale, and Los Cancioneros Master Chorale in Torrence. • The words of today's **second solo** — *Christ Triumphant, Ever Reigning* — were written by Michael John Saward, who also wrote the perhaps more familiar *Baptized in Water, Sealed by the Spirit*, (No. 482 in the *Glory to God* hymnal). Saward was a member of the clergy of St. Paul's Cathedral, London, and a church commissioner and member of the general synod of the Church of England. Along with a number of other publications, Saward wrote nearly 60 hymn texts and served as text editor of *Hymns for Today's Church* (1982). The music for *Christ Triumphant* was composed by British conductor and organist John Barnard, and the tune GUITING POWER is named after the small Gloucestershire village of the same name in the Cotswolds, England.
