# **WORSHIP NOTES**

Communion today is received by intinction. Please come forward via the center aisle, take a piece of bread, and dip it into the chalice of grape juice. You may return to your pew via the side aisles. All the bread is gluten-free. The station closest to the windows has individual cups of grape juice. Those with difficulty coming forward may receive communion in their seats by signaling the servers in the side aisles. Everyone is welcome to receive communion today.

An additional mission offering is received at St. Philip when communion is celebrated. This month we join Presbyterians across the country in the Pentecost Offering, which supports ministry to children and youth. The local portion of the offering will support Mo-Ranch Camp in the Rio Grande Valley. Gifts may be brought forward during the final hymn. At installation and ordination services conducted in the Presbytery of New Covenant, an offering is received to support candidates for ministry. Checks may be made out to the presbytery and placed in the offering plate. Loose cash placed in the offering plate today will also be directed to this cause.
